AN ORDINANCE

Relating to Duties of Customs.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Customs* Short title.
(Export) Tariff (No. 2), 1924.

2. The *Customs Ordinance, 1909-1916*, shall be in- Incorporation.
corporated and read as one with this Ordinance.

3. The Duties of Customs specified in the Schedule Export duties
of Customs.
to this Ordinance are hereby imposed according to this Schedule as on and from the tenth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four and such duties

Customs (Export) Tariff (No. 2), 1924.

shall be deemed to have been imposed on such last mentioned date and shall be charged collected and paid to the use of the King for the purposes of the Territory of Papua on all goods dutiable under the Schedule exported from the said Territory and on and after the date when such duties are deemed to have been imposed.

Declaration of
export value.

4. The Treasurer shall once in every month by order published in the *Gazette* declare the export value of copra per ton and such export value shall be the London market value at the date when the order is made for publication.

Repeal.

5. The whole of the *Customs (Export) Tariff*, 1920 (No. 17 of 1920) is hereby repealed as from the time when this Ordinance is deemed to have come into operation.
