AN ORDINANCE

To Amend the "Superannuation Ordinance, 1917-1925."

[RESERVED 19TH JULY, 1926.

ASSENTED TO 9TH SEPTEMBER, 1926.]^(a)

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Superannuation Ordinance, 1926*. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Superannuation Ordinance, 1917-1925*, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3) The Principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance may be cited as the *Superannuation Ordinance, 1917-1926*.

2. Section Twelve of the Principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end thereof the following proviso:— Amendment of s. 12 of Principal Ordinance.

“Provided that in the last-mentioned case if the average amount of the salary of the permanent appointments held by the officer during the

three years preceding his retirement shall be less than the amount of the highest salary received by him in the permanent appointment (or permanent appointments with the same salary) held by him for a period of three years immediately preceding the appointment held by him at the date of his retirement then the amount of such highest salary shall be taken for the purpose of such computation."

3. Section 13A of the Principal Ordinance is amended as follows:—

(a) By adding at the end of Subsection (1) the following proviso:—

"Provided that the Lieutenant-Governor may either before or after the expiration thereof extend the period within which such payment with interest thereon may be made by any such officer by any term up to one year but where the period is so extended the amount of interest to be paid shall be at the rate of Ten pounds per centum per annum on such payment from the commencement of the Ordinance or from the date of his appointment being so approved until payment."

(b) By inserting in Subsection (2) after the word "years" the words "or extended period."

4. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

Passed in Council this nineteenth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

Assented to by His Excellency the Governor-General, with the advice of the Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Australia, on the ninth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.
