

STATUTORY RULES.

No. 14 of 1940.

Made under the *Health Ordinance*, 1912-1924.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Health (Port Moresby Sanitary) Regulations*, 1940, and shall be read and construed with the *Health (Port Moresby Sanitary) Regulations*, 1922, as from time to time amended.

2. In these regulations unless a contrary intention appears:—

“refuse” includes offal, garbage, rubbish, bottles, tins and any other unwholesome matter not including nightsoil;

“Refuse Depot” means the Refuse Depot provided and maintained by the Health Authority pursuant to these regulations.

3. The Health Authority may provide and maintain a Refuse Depot for the Sanitary District of Port Moresby.

4. No person shall deposit refuse from the Sanitary District of Port Moresby in or upon any public place except in or upon a Refuse Depot. For the purposes of this regulation an employer of a native shall be deemed responsible for the acts of his servant unless the employer shows to the satisfaction of the Court that he took all reasonable and practicable steps to ensure the observance of this regulation by such native.

5. The Health Authority may make special arrangements with occupiers or owners of premises having unusual quantities of refuse for the removal and disposal thereof. Such arrangements may provide for reasonable payment for such services.

6. The Health Authority may permit an occupier or owner of premises within the Sanitary District of Port Moresby to himself remove refuse to a Refuse Depot. Such permission may be subject to conditions and shall be subject to cancellation at any time by the Health Authority upon notice to the occupier or owner.

7. No person shall convey refuse through in or upon any public place except in a vehicle approved by the Health Authority.

8. No person shall after using a vehicle to convey refuse use it for the conveyance of food for human consumption until such vehicle has been thoroughly purified.
