



STATUTORY RULES.

No. 11 of 1931.

Made under the *Native Labour Ordinance*, 1911-1930.

The "Native Labour Regulations" are further amended as follows:—

1. By inserting immediately after Regulation 29 thereof under the heading *Natives to be outside of town at night* the following new Regulation:—

29A. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding Regulation no native of the Gulf Division or of the Delta Division of the Territory shall enter remain or be within or upon or be permitted by his employer to enter remain or be within or upon the limits of the Town of Port Moresby or any wharf jetty or building erected on the shores thereof between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. without the written consent of a Magistrate and any person who permits aids or induces any such native to commit a breach of this Regulation shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

(2) For the purpose of this Regulation the limits of the Gulf Division and the Delta Division shall be as defined in the *Government Gazette* No. 8 of the 2nd of June, 1920, at page 202.

(3) In proceedings under this Regulation the averment that the native concerned is a native of the Gulf Division or the Delta Division shall be deemed sufficient evidence of the fact until the contrary is shown.

(4) The application of this Regulation may be extended as provided in Regulation 30 of these Regulations.

(5) This Regulation shall not come into operation until the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.
