

STATUTORY RULES.

No. 4 of 1928.

Made under the *Port Moresby Electric Light and Power Ordinance, 1925.*

1. The *Electricity Regulations, 1925* (Statutory Rules No. 3 of 1925), are further amended as follows:—

(a) By omitting from Regulation Two, Sub-paragraph (d) under the Sub-heading “Power” and inserting in lieu thereof the following Sub-paragraph:—

“(d) Off-Peak: When the consumer uses electrical energy only at such times and under such conditions as may be specially determined by the Electric Authority the rate of charge shall be Threepence (3d.) per Unit for the first Three thousand (3,000) Units used per month, and one and one-half pence (1½d.) per Unit for all current used per month in excess of Three thousand (3,000) Units. The acceptance of applications for the supply of electrical energy at the Off-Peak rate shall be subject to the discretion of the Electric Authority.”

2. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.
