AN ACT

entitled

Leaders (Benefits) Act 1987,

Being an Act, as authorized by Section 5 of the *Organic Law on the Duties and Responsibilities of Leadership*, to provide for the acceptance of a benefit by a leader, and for related purposes,

MADE by the National Parliament to be deemed to have come into operation on 1 January 1979.

1. INTERPRETATION.

In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—

“**benefit**” means the difference between the market value of a dwelling-house that is owned by the state and the actual purchase price paid to the State by a leader who has purchased that dwelling-house from the State;

¹“**leader**” means—

- (a) a person listed under Section 26 (*application of Division 2*) of the *Constitution*; and
- (b) the Governor-General.

2. ACCEPTANCE OF BENEFIT.

The Head of State, acting on advice, may, by notice in the National Gazette, declare that a leader may accept a benefit from the State.
