

PUBLIC SERVICE ORDINANCE 1932.⁽¹⁾

No. 22 of 1932.

An Ordinance to amend the Public Service Ordinance 1922-1930.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *New Guinea Act 1920-1926*, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1.—(1) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Public Service Ordinance 1932*.⁽¹⁾

(2) The *Public Service Ordinance 1922-1930* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Public Service Ordinance 1922-1932*.

Long leave.

9.—(1) Section thirty-six of the Principal Ordinance is amended⁽³⁾—

(a) by omitting from sub-section (1.) the words “one month on full pay or two months on half-pay” and inserting in their stead the words “one half month on full pay or one month on half-pay”;

(b) by adding at the end of sub-section (1.) the following proviso:—

“Provided further that ‘long leave’ under this section shall be granted only to an officer who is eligible for a period of at least thirteen weeks leave of absence for recreation.”; and

(2) Sections 2-8 inclusive, 10, and 11 amend the *Public Service Ordinance 1922-1930* and amendments so made are incorporated in the *Public Service Ordinance 1922-1940*.

(3) The amendments made by Section 9(1) are incorporated in the *Public Service Ordinance 1922-1940*.

(c) by omitting sub-section (2.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section:—

“(2.) ‘Long leave’ granted under this section shall be taken immediately before or after a period of at least thirteen weeks leave of absence for recreation.”.

(2.) This section shall not apply to any period of “long leave” for which an officer is eligible at the date of the commencement of this section.
