CONSTITUTION

REMOVAL OF CHIEF JUSTICE FROM OFFICE

I, Sir Michael Ogio, G.C.M.G., K.St.J., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Section 179 of the Constitution and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the National Executive Council, hereby:—

- (a) appoint a Tribunal under Section 181 of the Constitution for the purpose of removal of the Chief Justice; and
- (b) appoint Paul Akuram (a former judge) as Chairman of the Tribunal and Collin Makail and George Manuhu (current judges) as members of the Tribunal; and
- (c) refer the matter, together with the statement of reasons for its opinion to the Tribunal for investigation and report to it.

SUSPENSION OF CHIEF JUSTICE FROM OFFICE

I, Sir Michael Ogio, G.C.M.G., K.St.J., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by:—

- (a) Section 182 of the Constitution and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the National Executive Council, hereby suspend the Chief Justice from Office on full pay pending the report of the Tribunal; and
- (b) Section 169 of the Constitution and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the National Executive Council, given after consultation with the Minister responsible for the national justice administration, hereby appoint Justice Gibbs Salika as Acting Chief Justice.
