THE SCHOOL BOARDS OF MANAGEMENT (RANWADI HIGH SCHOOL)

RULES 1976

1. These Rules may be cited as the School Boards of Management (Ranwadi High School) Rules 1976.
2. The school known as Ranwadi High School at Ranwadi, Pentecost (hereinafter referred to as "the school") shall continue to be known by that name.
3. The Board shall be known as the Ranwadi High School Board of Management and shall assume responsibility for the administration of the school with effect from the 1st day of January, 1976.
4. The school shall provide a three-year course of secondary education and shall enter its pupils for the New Hebrides Leaving Certificate Examination and any other such examinations approved by the Chief Education Officer.
5. The Conference of the Churches of Christ in the New Hebrides shall be deemed for all purposes to be the owner of the school.
6. The Board shall be constituted in the manner following -
 - (a) two members nominated by the Conference of the Churches of Christ in the New Hebrides, one of whom shall be appointed by the Conference as Chairman;
 - (b) three members to represent the parents of the students attending the school from different islands within the Group, subject to the approval of the Conference of the Churches of Christ in the New Hebrides;
 - (c) one member nominated by the staff of the school, subject to the approval of the Conference of the Churches of Christ in the New Hebrides;
 - (d) a medical officer appointed by the Conference of the Churches of Christ in the New Hebrides;
 - (e) the Education Secretary of the Conference of the Churches of Christ in the New Hebrides ex officio;
 - (f) the Deputy Chief Education Officer ex officio, or in his absence an officer of the Education Department appointed by the Chief Education Officer.

7. A quorum of the Board shall be five members of the Board present and voting.
8. Appointments to the teaching staff and ancillary staff of a school including the Headmaster shall be made by the Board in accordance with conditions applying to the staff of the Conference of the Churches of Christ in the New Hebrides and subject to the approval of the Chief Education Officer.
9. Admission of pupils to the school shall be in accordance with minimum educational qualifications prescribed by the Chief Education Officer.
10. The Board shall fix school fees and may remit fees in accordance with principles directed by the Chief Education Officer.

These Rules are made under the powers conferred by sections 12 and 13 of the Education (School Boards of Management) Regulations 1974, this sixth day of January, 1976.
