JOINT REGULATION

No. 6 of
1928.

Regulation No. 6 of 1928 was published in *Condominium Gazette* No. 22 and is reprinted as amended by the following Joint Regulations:

1929 *Condominium Gazette* No. 32.

1930 *Condominium Gazette* No. 41.

Amend the coast charges of the Vila Radiotelegraph Station.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the present coast charges of the Vila Radiotelegraph Station in respect of messages transmitted or received by that Station, the High Commissioners of His Britannic Majesty and of France order as follows—

1. The coast charge for radiotelegrams received by, or transmitted from, the Radiotelegraph Station at Vila, shall be fixed at a uniform rate of threepence or one franc fifty centimes per word respectively of provenance.

2. The minimum coast charge for radiotelegrams transmitted from the Vila Station shall not be less than the charge for six words or is to say one shilling and sixpence or nine francs, provided that the minimum charge shall apply in the case of messages transmitted from Vila Station to ships stations and vice versa the rate in such cases shall be based on the word rate alone.]

3. Joint Decision dated 8th May 1916 and Joint Regulation dated 21st May 1917 are hereby repealed.

4. This Regulation shall be cited for all purposes as the "Wireless Coast Charge Amendment Regulation No. 6 of 1928" and shall come into force thirty days after the arrival in Vila of the *Condominium Gazette* in which it shall have been published.
